

Dear Friends,

The wise men saw the star and followed it. They were total strangers, foreigners from distant lands, complete outsiders coming to give royal homage to this tiny child. Today's Feast of the Epiphany is telling us that for God, there are no foreigners, no outsiders. From God's point of view, all people are equally his beloved children. This great feast of Epiphany's light insists on, is that we all, regardless of whatever external physical or cultural differences there may be between us, belong to one single family, which has one God and Father of us

all, "our" Father. It means that every one of us is a brother and sister to everyone else. There is no room for discrimination of any kind based on nationality, race, religion, class, gender or occupation. There cannot be a single exception to this position.

The facts of today's story may be vague but the message is loud and clear. We thank God today that there is no "Chosen People" whether they be Jews or Christians (or even Catholics). Let us try to understand more deeply God's closeness to us which is also a reason for us to be close to each other. There are no outsiders. All people are called – be it the Mother, the Step-father of Jesus, the rich and the poor, the privileged and the lonely, the healthy and the sick, the saints and the sinners.

Yet, we can become outsiders. We do that every time we make someone else an outsider, whether we do that individually, as a family, a community, or an

ethnic grouping. To make even a single other person an outsider, that is, to deny them the love and respect which belongs equally to all, is to make an outsider of oneself. It is to join the ranks of the Pharisees, the chief priests and every other practitioner of bigotry.

What a wonderful world God intended for us: a world without division, barriers and walls – where we would be brother and sister, not just to some but to all, respecting the humanity and dignity of all!

As I have spent time at the manger this Christmas Season, I have had a personal epiphany: As I have looked to the Bethlehem's Star, I deeply believe that the world God intended is possible but I also realize that it begins with me!

The wise men did not know where the star would lead them. They just followed it until it brought them to Bethlehem – and to Jesus. They never, I am sure, regretted their decision. If we can only have the courage and the trust to follow their example, I doubt if we will have regrets either. If we have not already done so, today is the day to make that start!
