But have we forgotten, have we lost faith that Jesus comes to us in our need? Jesus entered our world to help us and he said, "God did not send the Son into the world to judge the world, but that the world might be saved through Him." We need not fear God. We need not hide behind closed doors. For we have a friend who has come to help. We have a Savior who can rescue us from sin, from the grave, and even from the power of death as we hear this Sunday in the Gospel of Jesus giving Lazarus life again in this life. Anywhere Jesus is there is life. Isn't that what he says? "I am the resurrection and the life." Where Jesus is present, there is life. Where Jesus is present, we are set free. The keys to unlock anything and everything that we have allowed to imprison us are in Jesus' hand. Where Jesus is present, there is no need to fear. For neither sin nor even death has no power over us. Through faith in Christ Jesus, we are set free.

Lent reminds us all that Jesus comes to us in our need and has entered our world and our very lives to help us to unbind us from all of our sins and all that oppresses and ensnares us and to set us free to live fully, even now! Thank God because for as long as we live, it's never too late – but just a word of caution – don't wait too long!


