Who would have thought that relatively powerless persons could bring shifts in history? Gandhi, an unsuccessful lawyer, adapted the teachings of the Sermon on the Mount and the writings of Tolstoy and became the key to bringing independence to India, because he was ready.

Rosa Parks, in refusing to move to the back of the bus in Montgomery, sparked the beginning of the civil rights movement of the '50s and '60s. She was a rather inauspicious person to take such a critical action, but she was ready.

Nelson Mandela was sentenced to life in prison. He was released to bring a shift in the politics of South Africa at a critical juncture when many thought either that change would never come or if it did, it would be accompanied by a vast bloodbath. The transition to a more just society came relatively peacefully under his leadership after he was unexpectedly released from prison. Prison had prepared him, made him ready.

Mother Teresa, a rather unpretentious nun, is being considered for sainthood for her simple act of trying to rescue people from the streets who might otherwise die. She was ready.

And currently, there is a move underway for the for the advancement of sainthood causes for 6 modern of African-American Catholics. Father Tolton, our nations first modern day Black Catholic Priest, a former slave from Missouri whose family used the Underground Railroad to find freedom in Illinois. He trained for the priesthood in Rome because he was refused entrance into American seminaries and was ordained in 1886. and Pierre Toussaint, Mother Henriette Delille who founded the Holy Family Sisters in 1842: "servant of God" Mother Mary Elizabeth Lange, Foundress of the Oblate Sisters of Providence; and Julia Greeley born in Hannibal, Missouri, she worked and walked the streets of Denver collecting food, coal, clothing in a little red wagon and delivered the goods at night to the needy. She joined the Secular Franciscan Order in 1901; and Sister Thea Bowman, ground-breaking black Catholic, Sister Thea Bowman, who taught at Xavier's Institute for Black Catholic Studies. They were ready.

Each of them were not only ready, but in spite of their relative powerlessness changed history. They changed the history of the Catholic Church and they changed the history of the world. Who would have thought?

What about you? Are you ready? Don't ever think that you don't have what it takes to change the Catholic Church and the world! We're ready for you!
