But the Advent we celebrate in the church – The advent we celebrate as Christians, this Advent that has nothing at all to do with the number of shopping days left until **"Xmas"** – is altogether different. The promise of Advent is that Jesus is already present with us as we wait for him prayerfully again this **"Christmas."** Our times of prayerful preparations and the promise of Advent reminds us that God is still in charge, and hope is alive. And as long as the night seems, morning will come - in God's good way and Jesus will come to each of us on Christmas Day as we are preparing our hearts and spirits to receive again the coming of the Christ child into the world.

Together, as the family of St, Paul, let us prepare the way for the Lord's return!
