Dear Sisters and brothers,



This past Thursday, October 11th was Mental Health Awareness Day. I wrote that day that we need to make daily choices to maintain good, solid mental health, just as we should do for our physical and spiritual health and wellbeing. One easy but effective way is to choose to do a small act of kindness, speak a kind, positive word to someone, do a good deed for someone or for the common good.

The world we live in is harsh, cold, indifferent, mean. It belittles, bullies, dumps on, and trashes people. The way people treat others can strip them of their pride, their dignity and self-worth, sometimes people just plain outright ignore them or forget them. To speak kindness, to act kindly towards them, to recognize them with a simple greeting, good wish or smile has the power to change them and make a difference in someone else.

Here's a great example: In the book "A Window on the Mountain," Winston Pierce tells of his high school class reunion. A group of the old classmates were reminiscing about things and persons they were grateful for. One man mentioned that he was particularly thankful for Mrs. Wendt, for she more than anyone had introduced him to the poet Tennyson and the beauty of poetry.

Acting on a suggestion, the man wrote a letter of appreciation to Mrs. Wendt and addressed it to the high school. The note was forwarded and eventually found the old teacher. About a month later the man received a response. It was written in a feeble longhand and read as follows: "My dear Willie, I can't tell you how much your letter meant to me. I am now in my nineties, living alone in a small room, cooking my own meals, lonely, and like the last leaf of fall lingering behind. You will be interested to know that I taught school for forty years and yours is the first letter of appreciation I ever received. It came on a blue, cold morning and it cheered me as nothing has for years. Willie, you have made my day."

That made me ask the question, "When was the last time you made someone's day?" "When" really isn't the important question but rather, the commitment perhaps is! Why not make it a point to rise every morning, thanking God for the gift of each new day and then, decide to some small act of kindness for someone else and perhaps change their day!

Jesus made the day for the Leapers when he healed them ... Jesus has made your day and mine more than we can count. Why not make it a point to get up each day and make someone's day?


