Dear sisters and brothers,

It has often been noted that Jesus' favorite teaching method was the asking of questions. There are over 100 questions asked in the four Gospels. Of his parents Jesus asked, "Didn't you know that I would be in my Father's house?" Of the paralyzed man he asked, "Do you want to get well?" Of people who listened to Him teach but failed to act, "Why do you call me 'Lord, Lord,' and do not do what

I say?" No question is more important, however, than the question He posed to His disciples at Caesrea Phillipi: "Who do you say that I am?"

One of my favorite stories about Helen Keller concerns her introduction to the Christian message. When Helen learned to communicate, Anne Sullivan decided it was time for her to hear about Jesus Christ. Being a Bostonian, she summoned the most renowned clergyman of his day, Phillips Brooks. Brooks came, and with Sullivan interpreting, he talked to Helen Keller about Christ. Soon a smile lighted Helen's face and she beckoned for a chance to respond. Through her teacher she said, "Mr. Brooks, I have always known about God, but until now I didn't know His name."

Helen Keller was more fortunate than most people in her spiritual sensitivity. She knew God's nature but not His name. Most people without Christ know His name but not His nature. Jesus is the revelation of the nature of God.

If our greatest need had been information, God would have sent us an educator; If our greatest need had been technology, God would have sent us a scientist; If our greatest need had been money, God would have sent us an economist; If our greatest need had been pleasure, God would have sent us an entertainer; But our greatest need was for forgiveness of sins, so God sent His Son to be our Savior whose name is Jesus.

But you? Who do you say I am? How you answer will make a difference for all eternity!

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading — Eliakim is destined by God to be a father to those who live in Jerusalem (Isaiah 22:19-23).

TRUST

Keys hold great significance for those who carry them. They represent the trust and authority of the owner when given to another person. We may give our house key to a trusted friend to take care of our matters while we are away. We may give keys to someone responsible for maintaining or working in a particular building. Keys to vehicles are given to people who have proven themselves responsible drivers. The readings today focus on this kind of trust—the trust that conveys authority and responsibility. In the first reading, the symbol is specifically that of a key; but the second reading and the Gospel also speak of trust and leadership as they refer to the earthly church that Jesus established.

HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS

As we are in the height of hurricane season, we are currently watching two storms that are threatening the Gulf of Mexico that can possibly affect us, all of Louisiana and neighboring states. If you have not already prepared an emergency kit, now is the time to do so while supplies are available. To avoid long lines at the gas stations, fill up your car(s) with gas now and purchase gas for generators. When putting an emergency kit together, store enough supplies to last everyone in vour household for at least four days. Your kit should include: One gallon of water per day per person, pack nonperishable high-protein items such as energy bars, ready-to-eat canned food and food your family enjoys, flashlights with extra batteries, First Aid Kit, prescription and non-prescription medication, battery operated radio with extra batteries, fully charge cell phones with charger, have tools such as wrench, manual can opener, screwdriver, hammer, pliers, knife, duct tape, plastic sheeting and garbage bags, a change of clothes for everyone including hats, sturdy shoes and gloves, personal items such as eyeglasses or contact lenses and solution, copies of important papers including birth certificates, sanitary supplies, bleach, toilet paper, cash and coins, emergency numbers, and pet supplies, Don't forget to prepare for those in your family with special needs.
