


St. Paul the Apostle Catholic Church Staying Connected During COVID-19

December 13, 2020



Dear sisters and brothers,



The simple answer is that the celebration of the birth of Jesus draws near. The nativity is within sight. Christmas is almost here. Rejoice! We can see it in the stores, in the commercials on TV, hear it in the music, see it in all of the Christmas lights in our homes, on our streets and everywhere we look. Rejoice!

But many of us don't really feel like rejoicing right now. We have been through a lot this year. We have had to adapt to a new normal way of living. We are isolated. We can't visit the ones we love. Many have lost jobs. People who have never had to stand in line for food are now standing in line for food. Hours are cut on the job, people have been laid off, work is hard, if not impossible to find. We have to worry about being in contact with anyone who may be infected with Covid 19. We wear masks everywhere. Rejoice? Even for myself, it's tough. On top of all of the above, I'm being moved at a time that I don't believe is the right time – and it's tough. Real tough. Rejoice!

How do we face times like these and be people of joy?

Going through my notes and re-packing for this move, I ran across notes from Graduate School. In the early 1960s, the German theologian Jurgen Moltmann wrote a incredible book called "Theology of Hope". This work takes as its assumption that true Christian faith can only have its transforming effect on each of us, on society and on the world when it is rooted in a vision of hope. "From first to last, and not merely in the end, Christianity is hope, forward looking and forward moving, and therefore also revolutionizing and transforming the present."

Found myself realizing again that for us to live in hope does not mean that we live in a state of disconnectedness from the present because of some expectation of a greater although unrealized future; rather, to live with a vision of hope gives a person--and the church--the inspiration and the motivation never to settle for the status quo, but rather to challenge and perhaps even work towards transforming of any dimension of life that is not in line with what we hope for or envision. To live in hope ultimately brings us joy.

Hope – that's what made a difference for those ancients who looked forward to a Messiah even though they never saw him. Hope – that's what makes a difference in our lives as we also look forward to God's great gift of Jesus at Christmas. Hope is what brings us joy even in the midst of situations that catch us off guard and sometimes completely change our lives whether it is a Pandemic, a major illness, the loss of a job, the death of a loved one, or being transferred. Remember, to live with a vision of hope gives each of us the motivation never to settle for the status quo, but rather to challenge and work towards changing any dimension of life that is not in line with what we hope for that brings us ultimate joy. Yes, rejoice always! Again, I say, "Rejoice!"
