Dear friends.

Many years ago, in the church I served before I was ordained, there was a lonely old man, "old Thomas," he was called by. He had outlived all his relatives and friends but one and hardly anyone knew him. When Thomas died, this friend had the feeling that there would be no one to go to the funeral so he decided to go, so that there might be someone to follow the old man to his last resting-place.

Besides me and him, there was no one else, and it was a miserable wet day. When the funeral reached the cemetery, at the gate there was a soldier waiting. An officer, but on his raincoat there were no rank badges. He came to the grave side as I prayed the "Rite of Committal Prayers." Then when it was over, he stepped forward and before the open grave swept his hand to a salute that might have been given to a king. The friend walked away with this soldier, and as they walked, the wind blew the soldier's raincoat open to reveal the shoulder badges of a brigadier general.

The general said, "You will perhaps be wondering what I am doing here. Years ago Thomas was my Sunday School teacher; I was a wild kid and a painful trial to him. He never knew what he did for me, but I owe everything I am or will be to old Thomas, and today I had to come to salute him at the end." Thomas did not know what he was doing.

No pastor, nor teacher ever does. Many times, neither do parents fully know what they do for their sons and daughters. It matters not! Keep sowing the seed. We can leave the rest to God, including keeping the fire going. And that is GOOD news for all us tenant farmers.



HAPPY ANNIVERSARY ST. PAUL

A Time of Praise and Thanksgiving as Church Family, we can celebrate our 60th Anniversary with thanksgiving for God's steadfast love and kindness. Since 1960, St. Paul the Apostle has stood in the Eden Park Community, Catholic Diocese of Baton Rouge, and the city of Baton Rouge as a beacon of hope, and a safe and secure place to praise God filled with warmth, love, and charitable Christian services and ministries.

Much of St. Paul's success is due to the solid spiritual and liturgical foundation laid by the teaching and guidance provided by members of Caritas, a lay apostolate, (Eunice Royal, Rita Lombardo, Lois Deslonde, and Barbara Bahlinger) who came to St. Paul in September 1960 to organize and oversee our religious instruction program. With such a strong foundation and the leadership and vision of some amazing priests from the Society of Divine Word Missionary, we replaced a small café and some shot-gun houses with our current Parish Center on March 9, 1969, and built our current beautiful church in 2011.

Through the hard work and dedication of the founding members of St. Paul and their descendants, St. Paul's membership continues to grow, from a handful of members, about 50 in 1960, to a membership over 700. Over the years, we have broadened our viewpoints regarding ministries and moved from all-male ushers and altar boys in the sixties to gender-inclusive ushers and altar servers. Moreover, St. Paul moved from the Catholic Youth Organization (CYO) in 1969 to our current Youth Ministry, established lay Eucharistic Ministers in the eighties to serve during Mass, and added in the nineties a yearly Ministry Signup Sunday.

For 60 years, the congregational family has nurtured and cared for hundreds of the least, the last, and the lost who live in Eden Park and continues to provide Christian services through St. Paul Food Pantry/Bank and the Conference of St. Vincent DePaul Society.

As we look back, we must stay relevant, vibrant, healthy, and look to God for the present and the future.
