Dear sisters and brothers.

I have to admit that the gospel story this Sunday is a challenging text for me because I am a typical first child in many respects. You other first children may recognize yourselves in some of what I'm about to say ... and if you are not the first child, you will still recognize what I am about to share in your eldest sibling!

As a first child I want everything to be either right or wrong, no gray areas, and so, when things go wrong, I become a problem solver who wants to make it all right again. But that doesn't always work out, as I discovered the year when I was eight. Just before Christmas that year, I decided I needed to "fix" the family's Christmas tree decorations and, in the process of straightening the star on the top of the tree, pulled the whole thing over on top of me! Thank God my dad was there to pull me out and straighten up the tree again.

Our desire to immediately want to make things right doesn't go over too well in family relationships to our grown-up children, either. As parents, you can't fix things for them anymore; we can't kiss the scraped knee and make it all better. All we can do now is just listen and wait; be patient, pray and trust in the wisdom we tried to instill in them as we raised them as children of God and followers of Jesus Christ and active participants in the Church. We have to trust in the good seed sown by God's Spirit in their hearts. We have to trust in the fruit and the harvest that God — not we — will make in their lives! The amazing thing about God is that God does!

GOOD SEEDS

Today Jesus continues to speak to his followers using parables. What a rich treasure we are given today in three parables about the kingdom of heaven! The kingdom is likened to a man sowing good seed in his field, a mustard seed, and yeast mixed with flour. As they did last week, today the disci-

ples press Jesus for an interpretation of one of the parables—the parable of the man sowing good seed. Lest we think that these parables are simply amusing little anecdotes, Jesus' interpretation should be seen for what it is—a warning. Wailing and grinding of teeth in a fiery furnace await those who are children of the evil one. This parable points to the struggle for today's believer. Sometimes, through sin, we sow weeds and prevent the love of Christ from blossoming. Let today's Gospel help put us back on track. Let us recommit ourselves to preparing for the last days, the harvest, by blossoming as the good seeds we were created in love to be.
