Dear Friends,

In the late 1930's Billie Holiday, one of America's foremost blues singers, made a singing tour through the south. As she passed through one Southern City she saw the bodies of several Black men hanging from the trees in broad day light. Stricken with the horror of the sight she became one of many Black songster who used her music to speak out against an injustice.

She wrote a song entitled "Strange Fruit." In her song she noted that there was strange fruit hanging from the trees in the South, the bodies of black men, a fruit not designed to be there.

Shortly after anti-lynching laws were passed, the physical sight of strange fruit became rare, yet even today, they are still occurring. Racist elements of America would not desist. Although the law prevented further lynching's, they sought avenues that were both enigmatic and puzzling but would produce fruit just as strange, just as harmful and just as deadly as those Billie Holiday saw hanging from the trees.

As most Americans celebrate Independence Day on July 4th, we are reminded as Catholic Christians in America that we have the responsibility to remind our people that we live in a divided country where there are virtually two Americas where we struggle for justice and liberation, and to be mindful of the underhanded and snake-like nature of our enemy the devil.

Each ensuing generation must be warned that the same evil thrust that caused Black men and women to dangle at the ends of ropes 50 years ago, that same mentality still exists today. It threatens, in a more permanent and destructive way, to destroy our race internally, by destroying voter rights, civil rights, rights to quality education, jobs, housing, healthcare, access to quality food, just wages and protection from police violence just as effectively as if we all dangled from trees.

With the cross of Christ before us, we must remind ourselves and this nation, that freedom is a God-given right guaranteed to all of us in the Declaration of Independence saying, "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among them are Life, Liberty and the Pursuit of Happiness." As the nation celebrates Independence this weekend, we remember the Life, Liberty and Pursuit of Happiness God created us for out of pure love for us. We are precious in God's eyes as we are and wonderful to behold in the sight of God. Because God created us as we are, Black lives matter and that does not come at the cost of our personhood, our dignity, our self respect, or our lives!

VOTE SATURDAY, July 11**

Baton Rouge is holding a primary election Saturday, **July 11, 2020** for City Court, Division C and the 19th Judicial District Court, section 2, Division M. If no candidate receives a majority of the vote in the primary election, a general election is scheduled on **August 15, 2020**.

Baton Rouge is also holding general elections for the office of mayor-president, city council seats, constables, justices of the peace, 19th Judicial District judgeships, district attorney for the 19th Judicial District, LA Court of Appeals First Circuit judgeships, Juvenile Court judgeships, and Family Court judgeships on **December 5, 2020**. The primary is scheduled for **November 3, 2020**.

In order to have a greater future and leadership that represents our needs, we must vote for leaders who will bring positive change for all citizens. It is our moral obligation to be responsible voters. "There's never been a more important time for our young people to look forward to exercising their right to vote and have their voices heard. We encourage young people to make sure that you also play a crucial role in our democracy," Remember your parents and grandparents fought and some died so you and your children could vote. If you are a registered voter, you have no reason, no excuse NOT to vote. Elections are of great importance for our community, for the State of Louisiana and for our nation. We have seen over the past years efforts to erode voting and civil rights, efforts to obstruct justice, prevent health care for those most in need, prevent increases in minimum wages. Safety-net programs designed to sustain folks through hard times have been dismantled. Much of the progress of the last 50+ years is being threatened by politicians that give breaks to the wealthy while making the poor suffer and become poorer. We cannot stand by and watch or complain. Change comes through the men and women we elect to represent us. Each of us has a moral obligation to exercise our right to vote. Show up Saturday at the polls if you have not already voted... and make a difference!
