Dear Sisters and brothers,

This Sunday, Our Nation celebrates **Mother's Day."** And unfortunately, unless you are living with your mother, we will celebrate her day like so many days and events planned in the past 5 or 6 weeks – very differently. No Sunday Brunch after Mass. No family gathering with mom at anyone's home. This year we will celebrate, because we

want to preserve the dignity and sanctity of our family member's lives and ours by staying at home! But, because we must celebrate and honor mom today, we will as many have done for a long time, we will do again, "We'll phone home!" Or better yet, we will "Facetime" with her! It's her day and we need to show her our love!

I know a Mom, who tried her best to be a good Mom and to be fair with all 6 of her children. Her children, like all children, didn't really appreciate this and were always telling her she did more for one or the other of them than she did for all of them. "You love her (him) more than you do me", was an often-heard refrain from one or the other. Though the Mom felt bad about her children's reaction, she just continued to do the best she could to keep them all satisfied. She encouraged their individual talents, seeing them as God-given gifts that needed her encouragement, her support and her prayers. When they reached adulthood and were out on their own, each one doing his or her own thing, she often wondered if she could have done something else, something more to discourage sibling rivalry.

Imagine her surprise one **Mother's Day Family Dinner with a full house and table**, shortly after retiring, when each grown children told a story about a time when she made them feel so loved that they were able to take the necessary steps to succeed in some project that determined their future and succeed in their careers. They said that these memories have been a powerful force in their everyday lives and in how they try to parent their children. They ended their storytelling by singing "A **Mother's** Love is a Blessing!

If they are with you still, take the time today to tell her what a blessing her love has been as a mother to you! If your mom, like mine is resting in the peace God alone can give, lift a prayer of thanksgiving today and tell your mother what a blessing her love has been in your life! And if you are with your mom, your aunt, your sister, your sister-in-law, you are with one who is a mother, give them a hug and tell them today Happy Mother's Day – look them in the eye when you say it and then say ... I love you ... Let not your hearts be troubled!

VOCATION

Roman Catholics in the United States spend a good deal of time speaking of "vocation" and the manner in which each of us discerns our vocation for life. In today's apostolic letter, however, Peter gives us the "cornerstone" of our vocation, the description of what each of us is called to first and foremost by our baptism. He describes our vocation as "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people of [God's] own, so that you may announce the praises" of Christ, who called us out of darkness into light (1 Peter 2:9). All of us, no matter what path our life's vocation may take us down, have been chosen by God, made holy, and anointed as priests in the high priesthood of Christ through baptism. All of this, so that we may announce the praises of Christ. Vocation is given for proclamation at home, in the workplace—wherever life takes us—in service, in word, and in sacrament.
