Dear friends,

This year, 2020, will without a doubt go down in our list of, "It's been one of those kind of years!"

Covid 19 invaded our nation in the early months of this year, sweeping across the

land with it's pandemic force, the likes we have never seen in any of our life-times. We found ourselves quarantined, locked down, shut off from one another and from our normal life's routines. Workplaces and stores were closed, people lost jobs, schools were moved to "On Line Learning," parents became teachers, most ill prepared for the position and with a new perspective of how their children actually act in class.

Leaders were in denial, they fought publicly, they outright deceived the citizens of our land just to appear to look good as to the severity of Covid's deadly forces. Hospitals were running over with the victims, health care workers many never leaving hospitals protecting their own families and treating those in the grips of this new illness, suffered burnout without giving up or throwing in the towel. The most needed medical supplies were out of stock and others hidden and stockpiled in National stock rooms. Refrigerator trucks were turned into temporary morgues. We lost family members, parishioners, friends, co-workers unable to day good-bye or hold their hands or look them in the face one last time.

On top of that came a summer season filled with hurricanes. There have been 25 named storms, 10 named tropical systems have hit the U.S. Out of the nine hurricanes that have formed so far five of them have struck the U.S. and Louisiana has been in "the cone" 6 times!

This has also been an election year and from the onset, we knew that at least for some, it would not be our nation at its best. Building on hate, division, prejudice, racism, classism, xenophobia, fear and intolerance, we have patiently, diligently and prayerfully worked our way through to election day. In doing so, we have endured lies, insults, unsubstantiated voter fraud claims, voter suppression, encouragement of and threats of violence from people in positions of leadership that never should stoop to such lows. But it happens!

To top it off, most of us have likely faced our own tsunami's this year: illness, a financial setback, a breakup, a letdown, the death of a loved one, a friend moving, the unnecessary hate, evil, division of society.

Perhaps, like others, you may find yourself in something of suspended animation - waiting ... waiting ... waiting for what and who is coming next in a nation so deeply politically divided ... waiting for healing, movement, restoration Waiting for renewal, for reunification of all people of our land. And then remembering, through it all, God is right here in our midst - just as God always has been and just as God always will be! And so yes we can hold on a little while longer until our change comes, perhaps because like the wise women in this Sunday's Gospel, we have been prepared, our reserves from God's storehouse will get us through this too! Remember, God never fails!
