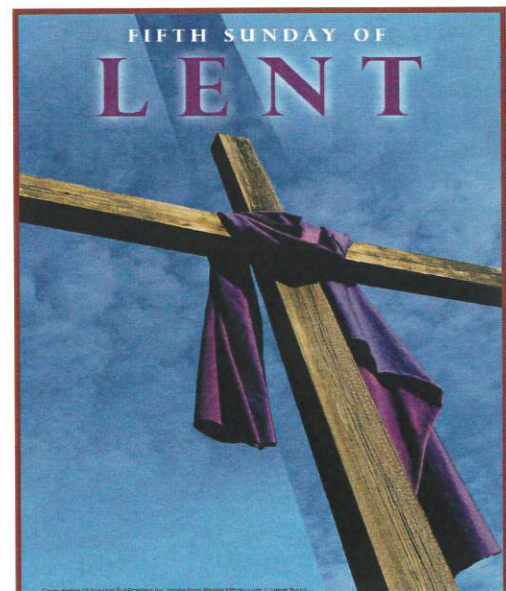

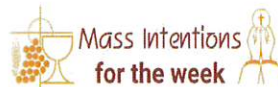
Make a Way

What's your comfort zone: emotionally, professionally, personally? We all have one. But did you realize that you can have one spiritually? Think about what you like and what you don't particularly enjoy when it comes to church, prayer, and liturgy. We all have "those songs" we turn up our noses at either because they're too modern, too old-fashioned, or too long. We all have "those people" in our parish whose ideas we aren't so sure about, whether it's because they're trying to change too much or because they seem always to be looking toward the past. Also, when was the last time you sat on the OTHER side of the church during Mass?

As much as we may not want to admit it, even (and especially) as people of God, we get deeply attached to our own personal comfort zones — and we tend to view those outside with distrust.

But what if God had a comfort zone? What if He viewed us, in our sin and misery, as too "far away" from Himself to reach? Thankfully, our God is a God who "opens a way in the sea and a path in the mighty waters." Our God is a God who does "something new."

The call to Christian stewardship demands that we look outside of ourselves. Our thoughts, our opinions, our preferences — these things are not important to God's helpers. Even if there is a vast, dry desert of conflict or a seemingly endless wasteland of opposing views between our neighbor and us, God challenges us to "make a way" out of our comfort zone, that together we may announce His praise. ©LPI

My Dear Parishioners,

Let us thank God for the spirit-filled Lenten revival. I thank you all for your participation and blessing. Many thanks to our Revivalist, Father Jaison Mangalath, SVD, the choir for leading us in praise and songs, and Mrs. Vera Dunbar for assisting with the programs. However, We regret that the inclement weather prevented us from attending our last night of the revival on Wednesday, March 30. Nevertheless, let us continue to celebrate this Lenten season as preparation for the celebration of Easter.

Last Tuesday evening, the Lectors and the Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion-EMHC (Eucharistic Ministers) of St. Paul the Apostle Church met as scheduled. A special thank you to all who attended and participated. We appreciate and acknowledge your sacrifice and service to our church.

Thus, on Sunday, April 24, 2022, at the 10:30 A.M. Mass, all of the Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion-EMHC (Eucharistic Ministers) will renew their commitment and be installed. Then, on Sunday, June 26, 2022, at the 10:30 A.M. Mass, all of the Lectors will renew their commitment and be installed. If any Lectors or Eucharistic Ministers cannot attend on their respective days, they can switch and participate in the installation ceremony on either day. **However, I ask that you please inform me if you need to switch days.**

The following requirements were agreed upon during our meeting on Tuesday, March 29, 2022. **These requirements will begin Sunday, April 3, 2022. Each Lector and Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion (Eucharistic Ministers) are expected to:**

1. come to Mass at St. Paul the Apostle on all Sundays; this is the Day of the Lord, and this is your church.
2. on the day scheduled to serve, be responsible for contacting another Lector or Eucharistic Minister before the day or hour to take your place if you cannot fulfill your responsibilities for whatever reason.
3. be in church at **least 10-minutes before Mass begins** when assigned to serve.
4. when assigned to serve, **gather 1 or 2 minutes before Mass begins with the priest, altar servers, lectors, and Eucharistic Ministers in the foyer of the sacristy** (near the sound system) for prayer.

Note: Right after the prayer, one of the Lectors will go up and read the introduction to the Mass. Then, **ALL ministers serving at the Mass will participate in the entrance procession:** ① Cross Bearer, ② Altar Servers, ③ Lectors (side-by-side), ④ Eucharistic Ministers (side-by-side), and the ⑤ Priest). All ministers will bow in front of the altar and tabernacle. Then, the **lectors will sit in their respective pews and the Eucharistic Ministers will sit with their families.** **ONLY** the Lectors will participate in the recessional; the Eucharistic Ministers will remain standing with their families.

5. If for any reason you are late and cannot make it to the foyer of the sacristy to pray before Mass, please excuse yourself from serving at Mass on that day; someone might have been already asked to fill in for you.
6. Lastly, each Eucharistic Minister is asked to take responsibility for visiting and bringing Holy Communion and a church bulletin once or twice a month, preferably on Sundays, to **at least one** of the sick or homebound members (elderly) of St. Paul's Church Community.

As we know, many of the sick and homebound are lonely and want to talk to someone. As an active Eucharistic Minister, this is an important aspect of your ministry. Many of our sick or homebound members (elderly) would like to receive a visit from our church community. And I need your help caring and ministering to them.

Please understand the importance of this aspect and help me! We will all grow old one day and will await such visits. Also, in this way, you can help to keep me informed of members who are seriously ill, in the hospital, or need to be anointed. **If, for any reason, you cannot bring Holy Communion as an EMHC to the sick or homebound, please inform me as soon as possible.**

Thank you for your great service, and I will continue to offer special prayers for you and your families.

KEEP YOUR KIDS SAFE ON THE INTERNET

Technology and the internet connect people worlds apart, and for kids provides an opportunity to learn, explore, and socialize. But there are also dangers that come along with the internet.

With schools moving to digital learning, your kids may be spending more time online. Whether playing games, having classes or socializing with friends, they are in front of a screen more than

normal. So, how do you ensure they are staying safe online? By talking to your kids, educating them, and putting safeguards in place, you can help them have safer digital experiences.

Just like you would if your children were going to a friend's house, it's important to set some ground rules, be proactive, and keep the lines of communication open with everyone involved.

Set Ground Rules

- You may already have rules around device and internet use. Discuss how these new scenarios will affect your current rules and establish clear guidelines on which sites, apps, and downloads they can access.
- If your child is doing virtual learning, be sure to connect with their teacher and school to get the specifications of what software and platforms they will be using and familiarize yourself with them.
- Keep your kids on a schedule with their virtual learning and online activities so you know when and what they are doing. Be sure to include time away from devices in the schedule.
- Discuss the importance of never giving out identifying information such as name, address, neighborhood, and phone number online.
- Know that you may need to adjust device and online time limits to reflect your new environment.
- Have rules about where devices live and can be used – public parts of the house where you can easily monitor their activity. At bedtime have rules around turning off devices and not having them in bedrooms.

Brainstorm some ground rules that make sense for your family or situation. Include the kids in the conversation.

Be Proactive

- If possible, connect with your children before, during, and after online use, just like you would if they were going to school or to a friend's house. Know who they will be with virtually, where they are going virtually, and what they will be doing.
- Talk to them about the apps and services they use, and how they use them to communicate. Pay attention to games and gaming systems, which often have online communication capabilities. Chatting can be an enjoyable activity that accompanies digital fun and learning, but it requires oversight and parental involvement.
- Online enticement happens across all platforms so ask questions, research, and be involved in your kid's online games and apps. Ask them to show you how they use them and do it together. For example, make an Instagram Story with your kids – this way you learn how it works and can see what they are doing on the app. You can also ask some questions based on this scenario – what would they do if they saw an inappropriate video? Do they know where the report button is?
- Now that kids are not getting physical time with their friends, they may be livestreaming or video chatting with friends and family. According to the [National Center for Missing and Exploited Children](#), livestreaming platforms gives access to millions of people at the touch of a button, including individuals who may wish to harm children. These individuals are aware of the unique vulnerability of children online and often entice children to undress, expose themselves on camera, engage in sexual activity independently and with others (i.e. siblings, friends, pets) and engage in self-harming behaviors. Have rules around when and where they can livestream and video chat - for instance, in open, interruptible spaces like living rooms and in the kitchen.
