



2025 JUBILEE YEAR OF HOPE PLENARY INDULGENCES



The Holy See issued a decree on May 13, 2024, outlining the many ways that Catholics can obtain a plenary indulgence during the 2025 Jubilee Year.

*Normally, a plenary indulgence can be gained only once a day. In order to obtain it, the faithful must, in addition to being in the state of grace:

- A. have the interior disposition of complete detachment from sin, even venial sin;
- B. have sacramentally confessed their sins
- C. receive the Holy Communion
- pray for the Pope's intentions (e.g., ay an Our Father and a Hail Mary)
- *E. You may obtain a plenary indulgence twice in one day if you receive Holy Communion a second time during a Eucharistic Celebration and apply it to the souls in

FMOLHS Measles: Patient Education

- 1. What is Measles?
 - a. Measles is a viral infection that spreads through the air, very easily from person to person
 - b. Children and adults who have not been vaccinated for measles are at high risk for infection
 - c. Being in the same location as someone with measles is enough to catch the virus
 - d. Pregnant people, HIV patients, babies and elderly are at higher risk of serious problems from measles
- 2. Do I need to isolate for measles?
 - a. Yes, anyone with suspect measles should stay home and avoid contact with people, especially those who have not been vaccinated
 - b. Anyone with confirmed measles should stay home until at least 4 days after the rash appeared
 - c. Household members who must leave the home for essential needs should wear a mask in public
- 3. How is measles treated?
 - a. There is no specific treatment. Make sure to stay hydrated, get plenty of rest
 - b. Give your child acetaminophen (Tylenol) or ibuprofen (Advil, Motrin) for pain. Do not use ibuprofen if your child is less than 6 months old unless the doctor gave you instructions to use it. Be safe with medicines. Read and follow all instructions on the label. Do not give aspirin to anyone younger than 20. It has been linked to Reye syndrome, a serious illness.
 - c. Do not give your child two or more pain medicines at the same time unless the doctor told you to. Many pain medicines have acetaminophen, which is Tylenol. Too much acetaminophen (Tylenol) can be harmful.
- 4. What are the common symptoms of measles?
 - a. High fever, up to 104°F
 - b. Lack of appetite or energy
 - c. Runny nose, cough, sore throat
 - d. Red, sore eyes
 - e. Tiny white spots inside the mouth
 - f. Rash (red spots or patches) that starts on the face and spreads to the body
- 5. What are serious symptoms that warrant emergency care?
 - a. Severe trouble breathing (for infants using belly muscles to breathe, chest sinking in/nostrils flaring when breathing)
 - b. Seizure
 - c. Confusion
 - d. Severe headache with stiff neck, sensitivity to light or very sleepy
- 6. How do I protect other household members from getting measles?
 - a. If household members are vaccinated for measles, they should be protected from serious illness
 - b. If other household members are not vaccinated, call your state's department of health as they may be able to get post-exposure prophylaxis with a vaccine or immune globulin
