





#### THIS WEEK IN BLACK HISTORY MONTH

Venerable Mother Henriette DeLille was a native and lifelong resident of New Orleans, Louisiana, and the great-granddaughter of an enslaved person from West Africa.

DeLille devoted her life to improving the welfare of her community, particularly for African Americans who were current or former slaves. DeLille's mother, a free woman of color, provided her with a strong education with the intention of Delille finding a white suitor. However, DeLille felt deep spiritual ties to her Catholic upbringing and began teaching at a Catholic school when she was just 14 years old.

After being confirmed in 1834, DeLille began pursuing a religious life. She sold her possessions and used the money to establish the Sisters of the Presentation, the second Black religious order established in the United States. The order was renamed the Sisters of the Holy Family in 1942. The Holy Family Sisters established Lafon Nursing Facility, which is the first and oldest Catholic nursing home in the United States, and they also educated slaves, which at that time was illegal. St. Paul's chapel/cry room is named Henriette DeLille, and it is in memory and honor of her service to mankind.

#### FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners:

God has blessed us with our beautiful church family, where we enjoy celebrating the sacraments and receiving God's blessings. I appreciate all of our involvements in our liturgical celebrations. Thank you. Keep up the good work. I thank you for your great cooperation, collaboration, hard work, sacrifices, and involvement that has helped us to retire our debt, to do the renovations of our office building, and to replace the roofs over the center, rectory, and Church over the past years. I really appreciate and praise God for you. Please join me in thanking God and our ancestors who have worked hard and sacrificed so much to give us what we have. Let us be grateful to God and be proud of ourselves.

As we think of the future plans for our church, I would like to share the following and invite you to cooperate and come up with ways and ideas to accomplish this task. I felt the need and have heard from many parishioners that there is a need for some work in our Center. Therefore, after meeting with the Bishop in November 2024, discussing and getting the full support from the Parish Finance Council Members (at the 1/15/25 meeting), Parish Pastoral Council members (at the 1/8/25 meeting), and getting the opinion of many of our parishioners from the Parish Family meeting held at the center on Jan.29, 2025, we have decided to do the much-needed renovations of our Center. We will replace the floors, renovate the restrooms and kitchen, and paint the exterior and interior to match our Church building without expanding the exterior space. This will cost approximately \$300,000 to \$400,000.

I have asked our Architect, Marcus Williams, to prepare the job scope; being our church member, he is so happy to do this. I have no plans of doing any capital campaign. Instead, I ask that you consider increasing your regular Sunday offerings while keeping this noble cause in mind. You are welcome to donate anytime towards the building fund. The church organizations may come up with as many fundraising activities as they choose to go towards this cause. If we all can collaborate in this way, we can plan to start the work in the summer of 2026. Please help me do this service for the good of our community through your cooperation, sacrifice, and involvement. If you have any questions or concerns, please feel free to write or talk to me. Let us also keep this intention in our common and personal prayers. Thank you.


