

THIS WEEK IN BLACK HISTORY MONTH



Venerable Mary Lange, foundress and first superior of the Oblate Sisters of Providence in 1829. The Oblate Sisters were the first U.S. based religious order for women of color. To date, with 194 years of service to communities, the Oblate Sisters continue to serve.

In the early 1800s, Mother Lange left Santiago, Cuba, for peace and security in the United States. Fate directed her to Baltimore, MD, where a great influx of French-speaking Catholic Saint Domingue refugees was settling. Then known as Elizabeth Lange was a courageous, loving, deeply spiritual woman. Although she was a refugee, she was well educated and of independent means, possessing monies left to her by her father.

On July 2, 1829, Mother Lange took her vows and took the name Mary. She demonstrated leadership and divinely daring in the face of poverty, racism, humiliation, and untold hardships. She was a role model, providing an atmosphere of faith and hope to parents and children degraded by slavery. In her school, Catholics and non-Catholics were accepted. By 1860, all of the Catholic schools for "colored" children in Baltimore were taught by Oblate Sisters.

Cardinal Keeler, Archbishop Emeritus of Baltimore, began the canonization process for Mother Lange. At present, she is referred to as Venerable Mary Lange.
