



THIS WEEK IN BLACK HISTORY MONTH



Steve Henson. Working out in the remote Alaskan bush in the early 1950s, a plumber named Steve Henson had a lot of free time. During this time, he invented the recipe that would become known later as ranch dressing. It gets its name because Hansen

and his wife opened up a dude ranch near Santa Barbara, California, after moving back from Alaska. The ranch's name, Hidden Valley Ranch, would later become incorporated as a food company. The brand was eventually purchased in 1972 by Clorox for \$8 million. Since 1992, ranch dressing has been the most popular dressing sold in the world today.



Lanny Smoot. With over a hundred patents and counting, Lanny Smoot is among the Walt Disney Company's most prolific inventors. His most recognizable innovations include the real-life extendable Star Wars lightsaber. This technology makes
