

DO YOU HAVE A REAL ID?



Starting May 7, 2025, U.S. travelers must have a REAL ID or another acceptable form of identification to board domestic flights ASSUE DATE 12-22-2019 and access certain federal facilities. The purpose of Real ID is to

establish a consistent and, most importantly, secure form of identification that protects against fraud and identity theft as well as acts of terrorism. You cannot obtain a Real ID online. You will need to visit a local office of motor vehicles or, to avoid the crowded DMV, you can pay an additional convenience fee and obtain one at a notary and title office that is Real ID-compliant. A Real ID costs the same as a Louisiana driver's license or identification card, and you will need to show your birth certificate or unexpired passport, social security card, or utility bill with your valid Louisiana driver's license or identification card. A star in the upper-right corner of a Louisiana driver's license or ID card indicates it is a REAL ID-compliant credential.
